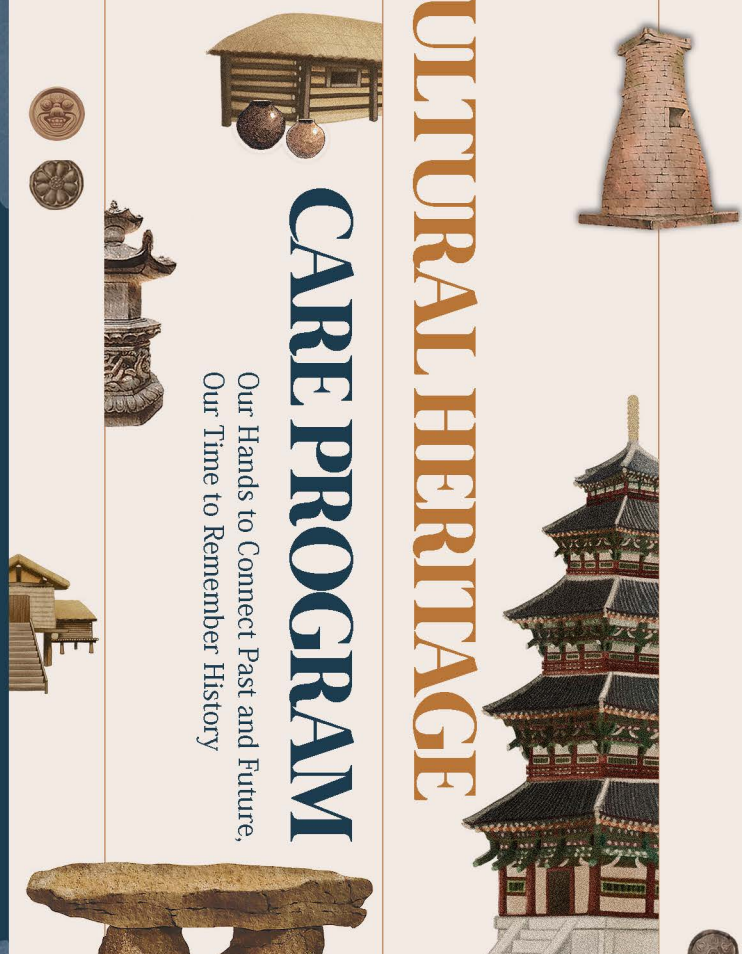

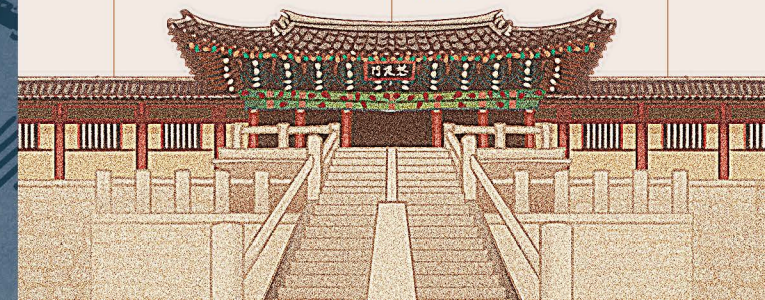

CULTURAL HERITAGE CARE PROGRAM

Activities to Prevent Damage Through Regular Management for National Heritage

- Problem identification by periodically monitoring the state of national heritage
- Prompt repairs for minor damages and emergency response in the event of disasters
- Enhancing the visitor experience at national heritage sites and preserving surrounding landscapes

Legal Framework

Act on Conservation and Utilization of Cultural Heritage, Chapter X-2: Interprevention Management of Cultural Heritage

Scope of the Cultural Heritage Care Program

Designated and registered cultural heritage, provisionally designated cultural heritage, and other national heritages such as local heritage and historical cultural resources that require conservation, or cultural heritage with high historical and artistic value as prescribed by Presidential Decree

- The Cultural Heritage Care Program is operated with the support of the lottery fund to promote social values.

OUR ACTIVITIES

Monitoring



- [Periodic monitoring] Assessing the condition of national heritage for any damage and the overall state of conservation
 - * Based on the results of the monitoring, follow-up actions such as minor repairs and specialized restoration are implemented
- [Monitoring of surrounding environments] Checking for any unauthorized changes in the vicinity of national heritage sites
- [Emergency monitoring] Conduction investigations upon natural disasters such as forest fires, storms, and floods

Minor Repairs



- Immediate response measures for minor damages to national heritage
- Temporary measures and recovery support to minimize damage in the event of a disaster
- Key activities: papering, oiling wooden parts, window and door repair, floor repair, wooden gate repair, carpentry work, surface cleaning of stone monuments, wall repair, roof tile repair, roof tile alignment, information panel maintenance, protective fence repair, chimney repair, traditional fence repair, drainage maintenance, thatch maintenance, filling, ground leveling, and ancillary facility maintenance

Routine Maintenance



- Routine management for maintaining and enhancing national heritage and its surrounding environments, and for landscape improvement
- Preventive management activities to protect national heritage and surrounding areas in the event of disasters
- Key activities: indoor and outdoor cleaning, trash removal, drainage cleaning, cleaning of information panels and restrooms, vine removal, landscape maintenance, roof debris removal, lawn mowing, weeding, CCTV inspection, fire extinguisher maintenance, de-icing and snow removal, rust-proofing, partial window and door treatment, and heating maintenance
